## ASHLEY MAN INDICTED AFTER MARCH 22 SHOOTING



A Delaware County Grand Jury has returned a five-count indictment against 41-year-old Christopher R. Sidders.

Charges come after law enforcement and medics responded to a call that someone had been shot at 9 North Franklin Street in Ashley. The call came in shortly after 11 p.m.

"On scene authorities found 39-year-old Jeffrey Shilt suffering trauma around the head and face area from a gunshot wound," said

Delaware County Prosecutor Carol O'Brien. "Mr. Shilt was air lifted to The Ohio State University Medical Center where he is in stable condition."

Christopher Sidders was taken into custody.

Sidders is charged with attempted murder – a first-degree felony with a firearm specification, two counts of felonious assault – both second-degree felonies also carrying firearm specifications, and two counts of having weapons while under disability – both third-degree felonies.

An arraignment date has not yet been set.

## FIVE SENTENCED FOR ROLES IN A RASH OF HOME BURGLARIES

The last of five defendants indicted after a rash of home burglaries last year has been sentenced.

The group was indicted in October 2015 after residents reported their homes had been broken into during the daylight hours. Items reported as stolen included jewelry, money, credit cards, televisions, DVD players and more.

Rickie Severt Jr., 23, pleaded guilty to burglary, receiving stolen property, and breaking and entering. He was sentenced to six years and 11 months in prison. Additionally, he will face at least three years post release control and has been ordered to pay \$13,677.99 in restitution and court costs.

Adam Steele, 30 of Delaware, pleaded guilty to burglary and breaking and entering. He was sentenced to five years in prison and at least three years of post release control. Additionally, he was ordered to pay \$13,351.99 in restitution.

David Lamb, 27 of Delaware, pleaded guilty to theft, burglary, and receiving stolen property. He was sentenced to five years community control and ordered to pay \$23,905 in restitution. Additionally, he must complete 300 hours of community service.

Shane Hooper, 27 of Marion, pleaded guilty to burglary and trespassing. He will serve two years in prison and will have at least three years of post release control. Additionally, he was ordered to pay \$12,152 in restitution.

Amanda Cain, 25, received intervention in lieu of conviction.

## COLUMBUS MAN INDICTED AFTER NEIGHBOR REPORTS MISSING GUNS

A Delaware County Grand Jury has returned a 10-count indictment against 25-year-old Andrew S. Fellure.

Charges come after a resident noticed several firearms missing from his home.

"The defendant in this case was a trusted neighbor who had access to his elderly neighbor's house," said Delaware County Prosecutor Carol O'Brien. "It is always important to know who is entering your home, when they are entering, and why they are entering, even if you know them."

Fellure is charged with seven counts of theft – all third-degree felonies, and three counts of receiving stolen property – all fourth-degree felonies.

An arraignment date has not yet been set.

## THREE INDICTED AFTER LEWIS CENTER SHOOTING

A Delaware County Grand Jury has returned an eight-count indictment against two men and one woman after an April 13 shooting and robbery in Lewis Center.

Just before 2:30 am deputies were called to the area of Holderman Street and Blue Holly Drive.

"Several residents reported loud gun shots and sounds of vehicles racing out of the

area," said Delaware County Prosecutor Carol O'Brien. "On scene authorities found multiple shell casings, several items of clothing, a pair of glasses, an earring, a lighter, and various other miscellaneous items."

Shortly after the first call, medics responded to a second call (in close proximity) of a minor reporting she'd been assaulted. Another call, also found to be related to the incident, had authorities responding in Worthington to treat a man who had been shot.

Isaiah Dezjuan Steele, 19 of Columbus, is charged with felonious assault – a second-degree felony carrying a firearm specification, improperly discharging a firearm at or into a habitation/in a school safety zone – a second-degree felony, receiving stolen property – a fourth-degree felony, and tampering with evidence – a third-degree felony.

Terrance Dwayne Jewell II, 19 of Columbus, is charged with felonious assault – a second-degree felony, robbery – a second-degree felony, and theft – a fifth-degree felony.

Kayle Marie Cantrell, 19 of Worthington, is charged with robbery – a second-degree felony and theft – a first-degree misdemeanor.

Arraignment dates have not yet been set.
