JURY FINDS NICHOLAS EBER GUILTY



Nicholas Eber was found guilty of stabbing the then OWU class president, Anthony Peddle.

The crime occurred in the early morning hours of May 3, 2014 at the Chi Phi Fraternity on North Franklin Street as Peddle slept in his bed.

"We are pleased with the jury's decision," said Delaware County Prosecutor, Carol O'Brien. "We hope this verdict offers some closure to Mr. Peddle, who has to live with the memory of that horrific night for the rest of his life."

Eber, 24, was found guilty of three charges, including attempted murder – a first-degree felony, felonious assault – a second-degree felony, and aggravated burglary – a first-degree felony.

A sentencing hearing has been set for January 26 at 9 a.m.

TWO INDICTED AFTER DOLLAR GENERAL ROBBERY





A Delaware County Grand Jury returned a three-count indictment against John Rohn and Brandi Moore.

Charges come after authorities responded to a "robbery in progress" call at the London Road Dollar General Store on December 2.

Both Rohn and Moore can be seen on store surveillance video.

"Delaware Police observed a male matching the suspect description running down the street," said Delaware County Prosecutor Carol O'Brien. "That male, John Rohn, was later identified by witnesses as the robbery suspect."

Moore, 31, and Rohn, 24, are each charged with aggravated robbery with a firearm specification – a first-degree felony, robbery – a second-degree felony, and theft – a first-degree misdemeanor.

Both are in jail awaiting arraignment.

"Three employees reported they had been forced together at gunpoint," said Delaware County Prosecutor, Carol O'Brien. "One of the employees was then made to turn over cash from the business safe."

Shaffer is charged with aggravated robbery with a firearm specification – a first-degree felony, three counts of kidnapping with a firearm specification – all first-degree felonies, theft – a fifth-degree felony, and receiving stolen property – a fourth-degree felony.

Shaffer is in jail. An arraignment date has not yet been set.
