Bond has been set at \$75,000 for 42-year-old Jose Angel Santiago Cintron of Delaware.

On February 17, 2017, a robbery in progress was reported at the Chase Bank located at 61 North Sandusky Street in Delaware.

"The caller reported a man, dressed in black, had demanded money," said Delaware County Prosecutor Carol O'Brien. "It was also reported that the man had held a patron at knifepoint."

Cintron is charged with aggravated robbery, kidnapping, and theft.

A trial date of May 2, 2017 is scheduled.

# DRIVER INDICTED AFTER VEHICLE CRASHED INTO HOME, INJURING RESIDENT

A Delaware County Grand Jury has returned a four-count indictment against 23-year-old Tyler Gentry of Powell.

Charges come after a September 5, 2016 report to law enforcement that a vehicle had crashed into a private residence on Dublin Road.

On scene, authorities found a red Chevrolet 1500 truck had traveled off the roadway into the garage of a home and continued through the garage to the main living area of the residence.

"The occupants of the home were inside at the time of the crash," said Delaware County Prosecutor Carol O'Brien. "One resident was injured when the vehicle barreled into the room she was in."

Gentry is charged with one count of aggravated vehicular assault – a third-degree felony, and three counts of operating a vehicle under the influence of alcohol or drugs – all first-degree misdemeanors.

Both Gentry and the resident received medical attention. An arraignment date for Gentry is not yet set.

## **DUO INDICTED AFTER GYM THEFTS**

A Delaware County Grand Jury has returned a 26-count indictment against 29-year-old Darvel Reed of Indianapolis, Indiana and 25-year-old Dexter Williams of Brooklyn, New York

Both men can be seen on store surveillance video shopping and using stolen credit cards taken from victims at local LA Fitness locations.

"In November 2016, victims reported their gym lockers had been broken into and/or their unsecured personal property had been accessed while they were working out," said Delaware County Prosecutor Carol O'Brien. "Credit cards were taken, and in some cases, keys were taken and used to search for credit cards inside vehicles."

The credit cards were later used at area retailers such as CVS, Target, and Best Buy.

Reed and Williams are each charged with nine counts of theft – all fifth-degree felonies, 15 counts of identity fraud – fifth-degree felonies, and two counts of misuse of credit cards – also fifth-degree felonies.

Arraignment dates are not yet set.

Charles Ingram, 57, was sentenced to 24 years in prison on Friday. After a three-day trial, Ingram was found guilty of the rape of a minor in January.

"Mr. Ingram took advantage of his role as a trusted adult to sexually assault a young girl," said Delaware County Prosecutor Carol O'Brien. "He was arrested in July 2016 after the teen victim told a friend of the abuse."

In addition to prison time, Ingram will also be classified as a tier III sex offender.

#### JURY RETURNS GUILTY VERDICT IN MURDER TRIAL

After five days of trial and nearly eight hours of deliberation, a jury has returned a guilty verdict against 32-year-old Jermaine Kelly and 28-year-old Reginald Conley, both of Columbus.

"We thank the jury for their service," said First Assistant Prosecutor Kyle Rohrer. "This was a detailed case, and we are pleased with today's outcome."

The case dates back to a November 9, 2012 call to law enforcement.

"A Galena resident contacted authorities reporting that an unknown male was banging on her door, shouting he needed help as a result of being shot," said Delaware County Prosecutor Carol O'Brien. "The man, identified as 29-year-old Dontee Gervins of Columbus, was transported to Riverside Hospital where he died on November 18 as a result of his injuries."

Kelly and Conley were indicted in July 2016. Both were found guilty of two counts of murder with firearm and gang specifications and one count of intimidation of attorney, victim, or witness in a criminal case or delinquent child action proceeding — a third-degree felony. In addition, Kelly was also found guilty of one count of having weapons while under disability — a third-degree felony.

Sentencing is set for Tuesday, March 14 at 9 am.

## MEN SENTENCED TO LIFE IN PRISON FOR MURDER

Jermaine Kelly, 32, and Reginald Conley, 28, were sentenced to 21 years to life in prison for the murder of Dontee Gervins.

Both men were found guilty on two counts of murder with firearm and gang specifications as well as intimidation of a witness after a jury trial last week. In addition, Kelly was found guilty of having weapons while under disability. The jury returned the guilty verdict last Friday.

"The case dates back to November 9, 2012," said First Assistant Prosecutor Kyle Rohrer. "A lot of work has gone into this case over the years, and although we can never bring Mr. Gervins back, we are pleased for the family that justice has been served."

## REPEAT OVI OFFENDER SENTENCED
