- -Jason Clark was sentenced to 1 year and 9 months in prison for receiving stolen property with a firearm specification, aggravated possession of drugs and having weapons while under disability.
- -Daniel Williams was sentenced to 7 months in prison for possession of a fentanyl-related compound. Our Victim Services Unit handled 4 walk-ins and 24 calls and/or emails referring to civil protection orders, violations, referrals, or safety planning.

## Court Update: January 8-12, 2024

- -Christian Odum was sentenced to 4-6 years in prison for aggravated burglary, trespass in a habitation, and violation of protection order.
- -Orest Semenchuk was sentenced to 35 days in jail plus 3 years community control sanctions for pandering sexually-oriented matter involving a minor or impaired person.
- -Joshawa Harper was sentenced to 3 years community control sanctions for aggravated possession of drugs and possession of a fentanyl-related compound. As part of his sentence, he was ordered to spend time in a community based correctional facility.
- -Nicholas Ogburn was sentenced to 3 years community control sanctions for aggravated possession of drugs. As part of his sentence, he was ordered to spend time in a community based correctional facility and perform 40 hours of community service.
- -Armando Salas Jr. was sentenced to 3 years of community control sanctions for strangulation.
- -Kevin Hawthorne was sentenced to 2.5 years of community control sanctions for passing bad checks.
- -Ghazi Al Share was sentenced to 2 years community control sanctions for tampering with evidence.
- -Kenneth Wycoff was sentenced to 24 months community control sanctions for assault.
- -Joseph Bradley was sentenced to pay a \$200 fine for improperly handling firearms in a motor vehicle, a misdemeanor of the fourth degree.

## Court Update: January 15-February 2, 2024

- -Kristal Miller was sentenced to 2-3 years in prison for aggravated possession of drugs, a felony of the second degree.
- -Jasmin Deramus was sentenced to 180 days in jail and 3 years community control sanctions for aggravated possession of drugs, a felony of the third degree.
- -Owen Parish was sentenced to 60 days in jail and 3 years community control sanctions for violation of a protection order and menacing by stalking.
- -Latoya Harris was sentenced to 35 days in jail and 2 years community control sanctions for theft.
- -Joseph Harper was sentenced to 30 days in jail and 3 years community control sanctions for aggravated possession of drugs and possession of a fentanyl-related compound, felonies of the third degree.
- -Jayla Sims was sentenced to 3 days in jail and 1 year community control sanctions for failure to stop after an accident. As part of her sentence, her driver's license is suspended for 6 months.
- -Tion Benjamin was sentenced to 2 years community control sanctions for theft.
